What is New Works?

New Works is an Engaged Scholarship course at Brown University that develops new dance theatre for the concert stage, for film and on tour. Utilizing Contemplative Practices, Authentic Movement, Physical Theatre, Contact Improvisation, Yoga and Buddhist Philosophy, West African Dance, Hip-Hop and Contemporary Modern Dance, New Works devises original movement operas. Inspired and informed by personal narratives, poetry, visual art, Rasa, Automatic writing and painting, the images and stories unfold. Members of New Works write text, music, poetry, as well as create films and projection installations.

An award-winning contemporary dance company formed in 2004, RAWdance is known for transforming theaters and public spaces with intellectually and emotionally layered performances. Through the unique partnership of Co-Artistic Directors Ryan T. Smith and Wendy Rein, the company has earned a reputation for its visually striking, kinetically charged works that consistently push into exciting territory. SF Weekly dubbed the company's work "edgy, sexy inventive fare designed to speak to audiences." Critical Dance has described it as "experimental work done brilliantly." Ousmane Wiles (**Omari Mizrahi**) was born in Senegal, West Africa. His passion for dance and the arts grew over many years of watching his mother and father Olukośe Wiles and Marie Basse Wiles dance and play the drums. His parents are the founders of the Maimouna Keita School of African Dance in New York City.

Omari has trained with Ron K Brown, Assane Konte, <u>Ephrat Asherie</u>, The House of Mizrahi and Marie Basse-Wiles. Over the years he has trained in Contemporary, Vogue, Hip-Hop, West African, and House dance.

Omari has performed with Rashaad Newsome, John Legend, Gargon City, Wunmi, Gala, The Maimouna Keita Dance company, Ephrat Asherie Dance, Forces and most recently choreographed and performed with recording artist Jidenna at the **MTV Video Music Awards**.

Omari Mizrahi received the status of Legend after 10 years of competing in the Vogue Ballroom scene in NYC.
